In the Spring 2010 edition, you read about Dr. Harold Witmer becoming the new pastor of Community Church in Clarksville, Tn. Under his leadership, two teams recently went on mission in Honduras. When Bro. Harold mentioned that they would need \$15,000, to send the two teams, someone commented, *"If you turn the church upside down and shake it, you still will not get that kind of money from them."* WRONG....

The youth took the assignment as a mission, worked extremely hard and wrote many letters for support. In short, God blessed their efforts and the trip was completely funded. It was my privilege to be part of this team effort to reach Hondurans for Christ.

Bro. Harold's motto is, "You cannot out-give God." He lives by that in everything he does. You will read about this wonderful mission trip on the last page.

The Government of Honduras has given the Genesis Project to Global Networks.

Two years ago, the Regional Director of the IHNFA, responsible for all things relating to children in Honduras, met with Global teams to consider the project they have called, "Genesis.". His name is Nahum and is a tremendous Christian man.

From the first meeting, he expressed hope that we could come as an organization and take the project.

In July, we made an agreement to repair the buildings and grounds and to begin the process of developing a tremendous ministry approach for rehabilitating children who have suffered many different debilitating things. Some of them have suffered from their own family; some have been sold into slavery situations.

We will have three years to fix and repair buildings

At the back of the compound we have an orphanage and another compound for more serious needs. We will assist the orphanage with needs as we move to repair the facility.

New Life with New Life Ministries

Wow what a wonderful meeting we had on Sunday morning with all the pastors of The New Life Ministry of Honduras. There are 14 churches at present taking part in this fellowship. We had the privilege of being in several of these churches on the recent trip and saw the hand of God work miracles.



Due to previous connections with a group out of the US, these ministers were skeptical. God had given me the word... "Unity" I expressed this to them and spoke about their previous situation. Each pastor spoke in favor of working much closer with Global Networks. We will have many wonderful times in the Lord with this group in the future.

Every skill and/or ability in building or repair is needed by this fall to begin work on our Honduras project. Please contact us immediately to determine where you fit into the scope of the work and make plans to sacrifice your time and finances to help these precious children. People are truly excited about the recent trip and the results of reaching over 600 persons for Christ. We saw two persons receive sight and one receive hearing along with other tremendous spiritual events.

Great Mission Trip cont.

From shortly after the teams touched ground in Honduras, the welcome mat was rolled out. It is always so nice to see old friends when you come out of baggage claim. The first thing they do is grab your bags and head to the vehicles. This trip we had three new folks to assist us and they were with us almost entirely through the trip.

Sister Martha, mother of Nelson, who is married to Karen, brought her vehicle and packed it full of luggage. The other vehicle to carry the remainder of the team was the truck of Pastor Dionicio. The Younger of the teams had an airing-out ride in the back of the truck to the hotel, which is conveniently near by. This is the first time we had used this hotel. However, the rate, security and over-all great services and rooms made this the place to stay. We will be using this hotel for lodging until we secure the missionary compound.

Each day was packed with activity. Thursday and Friday, we did two ministry stops each day. They included: music from the youth, puppets who spoke Spanish, a challenge to have a personal relationship with the Lord through the use of tracks, and special times of prayer. One of our translators translated the meaning of the songs sung by the group. On Saturday, the team reached over 400 children in one location, Camelote. The ministry to children concluded with a very special service on Monday night.

Ice cream was served to the children... (not only the children)... Many of them had never tasted ice cream. We now own a freezer and will use a generator to keep it going all day as we minister to the kids.

Other services were also held with both team involved until the first team departed on Wednesday.

In preparing for our trip, we had several short moments of training with everyone. Prior to the trip, I had been warned that we may be facing a situation involving demons. To prepare the youth.. and others... we discussed the Biblical situations in which demons are mentioned and the method used to cast them out. Naturally, Satan used this to cast a fear across some of the youth and more so, their families. This resulted in some not making the trip. All in all, God had the right group ready and they faced the challenge on the first Monday night.

Four demons were cast out of 4 sisters.... then their grandmother. When the grandmother fell before the power of Jesus name, she slithered around like a snake, including popping her tongue in and out, also like a snake. When the demons were expelled, we learned the name of San Semon, which is Spanish for St. Simon. This comes from Simon the sorcerer in Matthew. This worship has been passed down from an old Indian civilization and was offered in the form of an idol. They had worshipped this idol in their home.

The sisters, as well as their grandmother, testified that the mother had been very involved in this practice. She was not present. Thursday night, after the youth had left, I preached at another church nearby. The mother was there and the team went to work on her. She would never admit to the idol worship and stated that she believes in Jesus, etc. However, she failed to denounce the San Semon practice. Therefore, we believe she was not delivered this time.

Back to Sunday night prior...

The teams were in Laflecha Church. In this service two people received sight and one received hearing.

One dear older lady of approximately 84 years, came for prayer asking that we pray for her to receive sight. She was born blind and had to be led around by her sister all their life. She was very faithful to the church and wanted to be able to read the Bible. We began to pray.. after over 30 minutes, one youth experienced a transfer of some form of God's power and I took my camera and flashed it in her eyes. She was able to see a flash of sorts. Naturally we really went to praying and after some time she began to see tall objects... Then suddenly she said, "I see my beautiful sister." Naturally there was a halleluiah celebration.

Never in all my years of ministry have I seen the power of God manifest as strongly as we saw in Honduras. In every church we saw at least 75% of those present, fall under the Spirit of our Lord. The teams had an unusual anointing of power and Spirit for God. This occurred when we had translators and also when we did not. God did not care who spoke what... He just filled the place with Himself.

The test came when we returned home and time for reporting. This church had never been involved in such a movement of God's Spirit. However, on Sunday morning and again on Sunday evening, as the teams reported what God had done, people came forward for prayer. The Spirit fell, once again, on Community Church in Clarksville, Tn. God is not finished with us. **WE MUST BE PREPARED!!!**
